

VOTING IN THE NOVEMBER PRESIDENTIAL ELECTION (NEW YORK)

As a service to our members, the Tikkun Olam Team has gathered together information about the upcoming November election.

There are three ways to vote:

1. Mail-in Absentee Ballot

- Advantages: Voters avoid being in crowds and standing on possibly long lines at the polls
- Disadvantage: Currently, there are fears that delays in the mail service and in counting ballots could lead to not counting some of these votes

2. In-person early voting from Saturday, October 24 – Sunday, November 1

- Advantages: Voters will probably face only small crowds and short lines; ballots will be counted soon after voting
- Disadvantage: Physical distancing for covid-19 could still be difficult

3. In-person voting on November 3

- Advantage: Ballots will be immediately counted
- Disadvantage: Crowding and long lines will make physical distancing for covid-19 very difficult

At this time, there are two actions you can take to be ready to vote:

- 1. **Register to vote**, if necessary
- 2. **Apply for an absentee ballot**. Because the voting rules and covid-19 landscape are changing so rapidly these days, **it is prudent to obtain an absentee ballot to have on hand even if you are currently planning to vote in person**. Simply applying for an absentee ballot does not take away your option to vote in person. UPDATE: It looks like you may not even have to apply for the application applications are arriving in the mail unrequested! [8/23/2020]

It is advisable to complete each step in the voting process as soon as possible, in order to avoid delays at the post office and vote counting sites.

REGISTERING TO VOTE

- Do you need to register? Probably not, if you have already voted recently. **However**, **if your address** has changed since the last time you voted, you need to re-register.
- How to find out if you are already registered: Go to <u>elections.ny.gov</u> and click on "Voter Registration." You will see clear directions on how to check your status.



- If you are not registered, go to <u>elections.ny.gov</u> to register online or to request a registration form from the Board of Elections that you will mail to the Monroe County Board of Elections, 39 Main St. West, Rochester, NY, 14614.
- The last day for a mailed registration form to be postmarked is October 9, 2020.

FILLING IN AND SUBMITTING AN ABSENTEE BALLOT APPLICATION FORM

- In order to obtain an absentee ballot, you need to submit an Absentee Ballot Application Form. If you don't receive one automatically in the mail, click here to download or view a blank copy of the Absentee Ballot Application Form.
 - Question 1: For the reason for your request, if no other reason fits, choose "temporary illness or physical disability." Risk or fear of illness such as covid-19 is an approved reason to choose this option.
 - Question 2: Choose "General Election only."
 - o Questions 3, 4, and 5: Fill in.
 - Ouestion 6: Do **not** fill in. This question does not apply to a General Election.
 - O Question 7: Choose one of the three options for how to receive your Absentee Ballot.
 - O Question 8: You must sign and date the application.
- Submit your completed Absentee Ballot Application Form by mail or in person to Monroe County Elections, 39 W. Main Street, Rochester, NY 14614-1490.

- The last day to postmark a mailed Absentee Ballot Application Form is October 27.

SUBMITTING AN ABSENTEE BALLOT

• The earliest that you will receive your Absentee Ballot is during the 1st or 2nd week in October. Once you receive it, fill it out and deliver it in person or mail it in as soon as possible in order to avoid delays at the post office and vote counting sites.

- The last day to postmark your Absentee Ballot is November 3. The last day to deliver your Absentee Ballot to the Board of Elections in person, by you or someone else, is November 3. The last day for your mailed Absentee Ballot to be received is November 10.
